REQUEST THE TEST

Testing Options: Tick Identification ONLY or Testing the Tick for Pathogens It's Known to Transmit

- 1. Tick Identification ONLY
- 2. Identify the tick and proceed with the PCR tests based on species/host combination of the submitted of tick. See second page for more details.
- 3. Test ONLY for *Borrelia burgdorferi* (the causative agent of Lyme disease) for deer tick only. Only the tick identification will be reported for all other tick species and the tick will not be tested.

<u>RUSH SERVICE</u> - For an additional fee. Results are available in two business days if the tick is received before <u>2:00 PM</u>.

SUBMITTING THE TICK

- Review Page 2 of this submission form for additional information, including packaging instructions, the "Do's and Don'ts of Tick Submissions" and the available test panels.
- ALL TESTING INCURS A CHARGE FOR SERVICE
- Please note that in order to prevent a delay in testing and reporting the results, **every** tick submitted will be tested regardless of the condition, which include ALL factors (e.g. submitted in a foreign substance or the body of the tick is compromised) that may inhibit or impact test results.

Testing <u>will</u> proceed even if submitted ticks are in a condition not ideal for PCR testing.

PLEASE DO:

- Check our website to ensure you are using the most up-todate version of the Tick Testing Submission Form
- ✓ Use submission form provided on the CVMDL website (testing and reporting will be delayed if completed submission form is not received with the tick):
 → https://cvmdl.uconn.edu/submission-forms/
- ✓ Place tick in moist paper towel
- ✓ Place tick in **two** Ziploc bags
- ✓ Mail in a bubble or cushion mailer to protect the tick
- ✓ Clearly indicate how you would like to receive your results
- ✓ For billing purposes, ensure a parent or guardian's name appears on submission form, if applicable

PLEASE DON'T:

Submit the tick in:

- \rightarrow Alcohol
- \rightarrow Tape
- \rightarrow Vaseline
- \rightarrow Toilet paper, facial tissue, or cotton balls
- → Medical or prescription bottles
- \rightarrow Nail Polish
- $\rightarrow~$ Any substance other than water

★ Make an attempt to squish or destroy the tick

Send in a regular, paper envelope (passage of an envelope through the USPS automatic sorter may damage the tick)

Submit without a submission form

Tick Removal! **

- Use tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the host's skin surface as possible.
- Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Don't twist or jerk the tick; this can cause the mouth-parts to break off and remain in the skin.
- After removing the tick, thoroughly clean the bite area and your hands.
